Events

Society AGM: RSCDS held its 2008 Annual General Meeting on November 8 in Perth. Following on some of the managerial and financial challenges faced by the Society over the last couple years, this year’s AGM was important in setting the tone for reform of its operations. Alex Gray is taking over as the new Chair of the Society, and is promising to reform financial management and re-focus the Society’s efforts on its core mission. The AGM took action on three motions from Branches which impact the structuring of membership and the workings of the AGM. The passage of Aberdeen Branch’s motion amends the membership structure, effective July 1, 2009, to include the following categories:

- 1) Adult Single, age 25+
- 2) Youth, age 12 to 17, with dues at 50% of the Adult Single Rate
- 3) Young Adult, age 18 to 25, with dues at 80% of the Adult Single Rate
- 4) Adult Joint, two adults at the same address, with dues at 80% of twice the Adult Single Rate

The Branch Committee is working to adapt our own membership structure to be sympathetic with these changes. We may need to put a motion before our own AGM in May to consider this restructuring – stay tuned! The passage of New Zealand Branch’s motion to allow “proxy” voting by AGM delegates means that a single Branch delegate to the AGM may cast up to three of the votes to which the Branch is entitled. This will make it easier for some the larger, more far-flung Branches to participate fully in Society affairs. A final New Zealand Branch motion, to de-link Branch and Society membership, was replaced with a counter-motion by the Society Management Board to undertake a thorough financial and institutional review of the issues and to report to the membership by June 5, 2009. These outcomes are in exactly line with our Committee’s desires, and our heartfelt thanks go to our delegates for representing our interests: Robert McKay, Pat Houghton, Harry Andrews, Margaret Renton, Craig Houston, Eric Finley, Andrew McConnell, and Philip Whitley.

Youth Weekend West 2009: Youth Weekend West is coming to the Bay Area May 29th to 31st, 2009. Representatives from the Berkeley Class are taking a strong lead in getting this event organized. This will be a Branch Special Event, with funding managed through its Organizing Committee, headed by Chairs Catherine Berner and Zuriyah Meacham. In accordance with the spirit of the Event, this will be an opportunity for young people

How To Get There:

LUCIE STERN

FROM 280: Take Page Mill Road east and turn left on Middlefield. The hall will be on your right.

FROM 101: Take Embarcadero west. Turn right on Middlefield. The hall will be on your right.

ALAMEDA MASONIC TEMPLE

(between Park and Oak Streets).

FROM THE SOUTH: Take 880 North, exit at High Street (south of the Bay Bridge) and drive west across the High Street bridge into Alameda. Continue on High Street for about six blocks and turn right on Central Avenue. Go for another 10 blocks to Park Street (with traffic light, past Park Avenue). Turn left on Park Street, go one block and turn right on Alameda Avenue. The Masonic Temple is on the left about 1/2 block before Oak Street.

FROM THE NORTH: Take 880 South and exit at 23rd Avenue. When you have crossed the bridge going west, you will be on Park Avenue. Continue on Park until you come to Alameda Avenue and turn right. There is free parking after 6:00 p.m. in a city lot right across the street from the Temple, but accessible only from Central Avenue, one block east. You can turn right from Alameda onto Oak, right on Central and right into the lot, after about 1/2 block—or just drive straight across Park the lot after about 1/2 block, and walk to the Temple at the far end of the lot. The party will be in the Banquet Room on the fourth floor. There is an elevator.

Elizabeth Wright, a very active member of our dance community has moved to France. A few years ago she organized Scottish Dancing demonstrations during the annual Bay Area National Dance Week. In order for us to continue participating an event where we dance alongside all the various dance groups in the Bay Area (great publicity for us!) she's asking for us to step forth and become involved. I'll reprint her memo to the Branch Committee, teachers, and managers per her request.

Attention all RSCDS-SF Class Managers and Teachers:

Bay Area National Dance Week is happening again for 2009—10 days of dance events free and open to the public April 24-May 3, beginning with a Kick-Off Conga Line around Union Square at noon on Friday April 24, in which all groups are invited to participate! Registration begins in December 2008, and can be done entirely online: <http://www.bacndw.org/>

Our Branch sponsored five events for BANDW in 2007, and seven events for BANDW 2008; each year over 60 people new to Scottish dance attended these events. If you have not participated before, and want to learn about the experiences of groups who did, here is the list of our Branch participants from the past two years: Lafayette Children and Adult classes; New World Scottish Dancers; San Francisco Youth and Adult classes; Berkeley Youth and Adult classes; The Dunsmuir Scottish Dancers; Livermore Family and Adult classes. In addition, in 2008 we sponsored an introductory class before the May monthly party

and AGM in Alameda.

There are many ways to participate in BANDW—you can host an introductory class, give a lecture-demonstration, hold a ceildh, or whatever format you choose. The event must be free to the general public, but you may still charge your usual class fee to previously enrolled students if you choose to do so.

The RSCDS-SF Branch Committee has again agreed to reimburse Branch classes or groups for registration fees for this event, up to \$300 total for the Branch. You can be reimbursed for your registration fee by sending the documentation to Louise M Brewer, Branch Treasurer.

This year, there will be no central Branch coordinator for the event, as our experience from the past two years indicates that it will be less expensive and more efficient for each class or group to register separately. The fees will be less for groups who have a budget of \$100,000 or less, and each group or class will be eligible for the \$25 early registration discount. In addition, each group or class will be able to send in up to 3 photos for the Events Guide, to proofread and edit its own listings, and be in direct communication with the BANDW organizers.

We encourage you to participate—it's a great way to get more exposure for your class or group, and make connections with other dance groups in the Bay Area. There's also a free marketing workshop in March for all participants, where you can learn a lot of valuable tips.

to get involved in organizing, managing, and running an important Branch function. The Organizing Committee has presented a first working budget to the Branch Committee, and this will be refined over the coming months. We’re looking forward to welcoming a large contingent of young people from all over western North America, to share a weekend of dances, workshops, and, of course, a Ball. Mark your calendars!

Bay Area National Dance Week 2009: Bay Area National Dance Week will take place from April 24 to May 4, 2009. Elizabeth Wright, who so ably organized the Branch’s participation in this Event in 2007 and 2008, has decided to pursue her passions in France. However, the organizers of BANDW have changed their management structure a bit, and it promises to be simple for our individual Classes to organize their own participation. The Branch Committee has set aside a budget to support the Classes’ advertising efforts, and additional information will be circulating shortly.

Reports

Treasurer: Louise Brewer summarized the 2007 Fiscal Year for the Branch, showing gross revenues of \$270,300, including \$19,000 in donations, against gross expenses of \$252,000. Cash assets have increased from \$140,000 to \$158,000. The 2007 figures include the effort on the new low Stage, and so are somewhat out of step with our usual pattern. The Branch Committee is concerned about the increasing costs of Party and Event operations, and the dip in Membership renewals we had this fall, indicating that we may have increasing difficulty in breaking even. Against this, the sudden and dramatic swing in the dollar / pound sterling exchange rate this fall means that the Society dues burden for

members will likely decrease next year, and we may be able to recapture some lapsed Members. The Branch Committee will be reviewing our financial structure with care, as we also refine the membership structure this spring.

Corresponding: Donna Weidenfeller has been very busy with all of our correspondence with the Society surrounding the AGM and the Motions under consideration. In support of the Society’s efforts, the Branch Committee sent a letter to the outgoing Society Chair, Irene Bennett, and the incoming Chair, Alex Gray, expressing:

- 1) Our Branch’s support of the Society’s continuing efforts are reform.
- 2) Our desire that, when significant changes are proposed, that the impact of those changes on overseas Branches be carefully considered.
- 3) Our desire that, when changes are to be made, that overseas Branches be given sufficient warning so that we can properly inform our own members.
- 4) Our warm welcome to Alex Gray in his visit with our Branch at Asilomar.

Donna also reports that the online Survey advertized in Scottish Dancer Magazine has been extended. Please visit www.phoenix.co.nz/esurvey6 to provide your own input to the Society’s new direction.

Teachers: The Teachers Committee ran a very successful Workshop this fall, with valuable instruction on teaching technique provided by the new Society Chair, Alex Gray. Teachers and other advanced dancers in attendance gained new insight into the finer points of dance instruction for large groups, and also received some valuable reinforcement on the Importance of Covering Well.

Other Items

Branch Committee Participation: Our Nominating Committee will be active in January, seeking out new members for the Branch Committee. We’ll probably have a “retirement” or two this year, so it’s time to find some new talent. I’ve found work on the Branch Committee to be a great way to become more familiar with the people across the Branch, with the history of the Branch, and with the workings of the larger Society. The terms are for two years (September thru June), and involve eight half-Saturday meetings each year, located to coordinate with the Monthly Party venues. If you’d like to help out, make your interests known to a current member of the Branch Committee – we’d be glad to talk to you!

Microphone System: The Branch is investing in a new state-of-the-art professional wireless microphone system. This will be available for Branch Events, such as Asilomar, where someone has to talk to an entire room while moving around. This will make it easier to host and manage larger-scale activities, and increase the enjoyment of all those in attendance.

Website Liaison: Witsie McKelvy has volunteered to support our Webmaster, Larry Wakeman, as an additional liaison with members of the Branch for issues related to the Website. If you have any thoughts on how the Branch Website might be improved, share your inspirations with Witsie, and she’ll help move things along.

Youth Weekend West 2009

We've all heard about or observed the "graying of the Society". We've all heard or stated ourselves that something needs to be done to "find new blood" and recruit younger members into the Society. In an effort to change this graying trend and to recruit younger dancers, youth weekends have started taking place in different parts of the world. In Western North America, we have had Youth Weekend West (YWW) workshops for the past six years in British Columbia and Washington. For the first time, YWW will be hosted in the San Francisco Bay Area in May 2009!

These youth weekend workshops are special in that the entire event is focused on youth dancers and they are organized and run by the youth themselves, with some experienced adult guidance as necessary. I have been invited to teach at a couple of the first weekends in the Pacific Northwest, and it is incredible to be a part of the high energy and vitality that these youth dancers expend during the weekend! It is truly sensational to view and to experience!

YWW 2009 is scheduled for May 29-31, 2009. The Friday and Saturday events will be in the Berkeley area and restricted to youth dancers (age 12-30ish), but a Sunday afternoon Tea Dance is open to all to attend. The dance will be held at the Lake Merritt Dance Center in Oakland, and Fiddlesticks and Ivory are scheduled to play. I highly encourage all of you to come to the Tea Dance! We hope to have youth dancers from the entire North American West Coast in attendance! You will definitely find it a rewarding experience!

As previously stated, these youth weekends are completely organized and run by the youth. A committee of our youth dancers has been hard at work on YWW 2009 for almost a year with Mary McQuilliams as their adult liaison. The YWW organizing committee has received official sanction and support from the Branch Committee, but they will need help and support from some of us in planning the weekend's details, so please donate your time and talents if you are asked. As with most SCD events, funds are scarce, so the organizing committee needs to fundraise to help support this event.

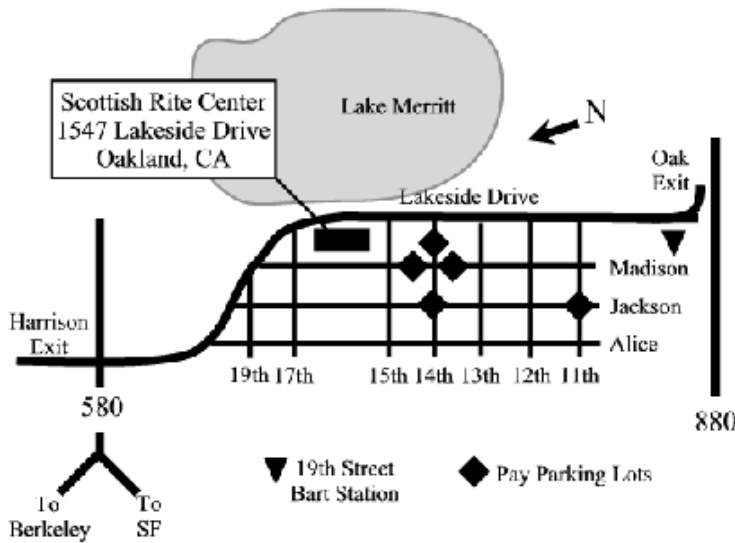
